## **CoSA Instrumental Music and Musical Theatre Revue Performances**

Instrumental musicians perform classical and jazz pieces on December 17 and the musical theatre department presents Broadway selections on December 18.

The instrumental music concert will feature works by Beethoven, Villa Lobos, Tchaikovsky, Wayne Shorter, and Steely Dan, along with a wide variety of holiday music including an excerpt from *The Nutcracker*. The performance will take place in the intimate Black Box Theatre on Wednesday, December 17, at 7:00 p.m. at Coronado High School at 650 D Avenue. Tickets are available at the door for just \$5.

All CoSA musical theatre students will perform in group numbers singing such great songs as “One,” the finale from *Chorus Line*, “Money Money Money” from *Mama Mia*, “Shoeless Joe from Hannibal, Mo” from *Damn Yankees*, “I Believe” from *Spring Awakening*, and “They Both Reached for the Gun” from *Chicago*. Dance pieces in the musical theatre revue are comprised of tap, jazz, hip hop, Bollywood, and ballet including “Dance of the Baby Swans” from *Swan Lake*. Tickets are available at the door and cost \$10 for adults and \$5 for students.
